

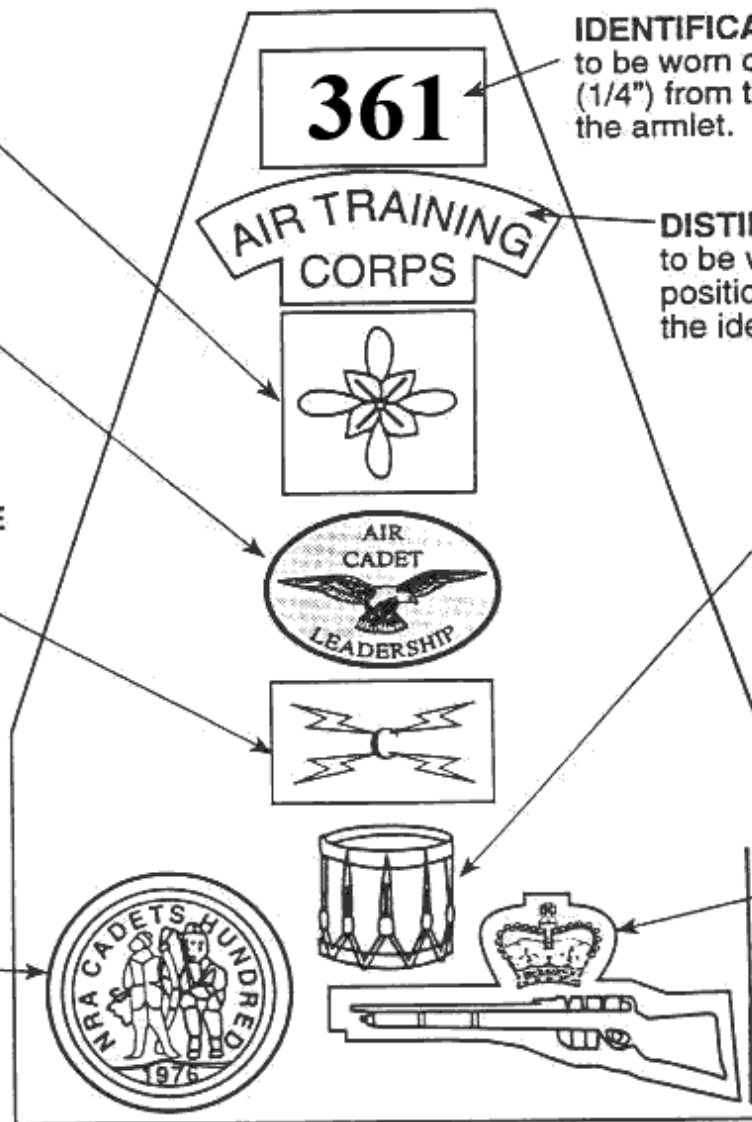
POSITION OF ATC BADGES ON THE BRASSARD

FIRST CLASS LEADING or SENIOR CADET BADGES to be worn in a central position immediately below the distinguishing badge.

LEADERSHIP COURSE BADGE to be worn in a central position directly below the classification badge.
(Badge a. See note 4)

COMMUNICATOR BADGE to be worn in a central position directly below the leadership badge or the classification badge where the leadership badge has not been awarded.
(Badge b. See note 4)

CADET HUNDRED BADGE to be fixed on the left side of the arm-let 6mm above the lower edge with a space of 12mm (1/2") from the marksman's badge.



IDENTIFICATION BADGE to be worn centrally 6mm (1/4") from the top edge of the armlet.

DISTINGUISHING BADGE to be worn in a central position immediately below the identification badge.

BANDSMAN'S BADGE (Drum, crossed trumpets, pipes or lyre) to be worn in a central position with the bottom edge of the badge 75mm (3") from the lower edge of the armlet.
(Badge c. See note 4)

MARKSMAN'S BADGE (RAF marksman or ATC marksman) to be fixed on the right hand side of the armlet 6mm (1/4") above the lower edge with a space of 12mm (1/2") from the cadet hundred badge

- NOTES**
- (1) Where only the RAF or Air Cadet marksman's badge is worn this is to be affixed centrally 6mm (1/4") above the lower edge.
 - (2) The Duke of Edinburgh's Award badge is to be worn centrally on the right breast patch of the jersey.
 - (3) Flying scholarship and gliding badges are worn on the left breast patch of the jersey.
 - (4) Where Cadets have earned, and wish to wear, the "crossed rifle" marksman badge and are also eligible to wear badges a. b. and c., they will have to choose which of a. b. or c. they wish to display on their brassard.
